A syllogism has the pattern: $a \rightarrow b$ $b \rightarrow c$ $\therefore a \rightarrow c$

Suppose that three terms of a syllogism are:

- a, "you keep quiet"
- b, "others will never hear you make a mistake"
- c, "others will think you are wise"
- 1. Write the two premises of the syllogism as conditional statements.
- 2. Write the conclusion of the syllogism.

Consider the following statements:

A duck would ask for some Chapstick if he went to a drugstore.

If a duck had sore lips, he would go to a drugstore.

A duck would ask to have it put on his bill if he asked for some Chapstick.
