"Decorating" Sentences

You can take a basic and add "decorations" to make it more interesting and more powerful.



Types of "Decorations" Plain sentence: Bird fly.

Prepositional phrase	Birds fly <u>across the lake</u> . <u>Between the mountains</u> , birds fly. Birds <u>in the Amazon rain forest</u> fly.
Adjectives	Graceful birds fly.
Adverbs	Birds fly <u>silently</u> . Birds <u>suddenly</u> fly. <u>Swiftly,</u> birds fly.
Appositive	Birds, <u>my favorite animals</u> , fly.
Adverb clause	When the sun rises, birds fly. Birds fly as the storm approaches.
Participial phrase	Catching the wind, birds fly. Startled by the noise, bird fly.
Infinitive phrase	To reach the south by winter, birds fly.
Join two short sentences together	Birds fly, <u>but</u> worms crawl.

You can even add multiple decorations to one sentence.



Graceful birds fly silently across the lake as the storm approaches.
