Mountain Ranges: Atlas, Drakensberg, Ethiopian Highlands, Ruwenzori

Lakes: Victoria, Tanganyika, Malawi, Turkana, Albert

Deserts: Sahara, Kalahari, Namib

Large Cities: Cairo (Egypt), Lagos (Nigeria), Kinshasa (DRC), Luanda (Angola)
Johannesburg (South Africa)
